Peabody Australia, in partnership with the Minerals Council of Australia, the national body representing Australia's mining and minerals processing industry, invites students from the University of Wollongong to apply for the Peabody/Minerals Council of Australia Women in Engineering Scholarship.

The Peabody/MCA partnership is helping identify the next generation of talented female engineers. The scholarship is open to all female undergraduate engineering students studying in Australia and provides \$8000 per annum for the final two years of study. To be eligible for the Women in Engineering Scholarship, you must:

- Be currently enrolled in full-time study in an Engineering degree (Mining, Electrical, Environmental, Mechanical etc).
- Be in the final 2 years of an Engineering degree
- Have a GPA of 5 or more (or equivalent to 65% or more)
- Include an accompanying CV
